#### Winter Highlight

In January, CACH conducted a successful Point-in-Time (PIT) Count, mobilizing over 100 volunteers and identifying 300+ individuals experiencing homelessness and housing instability in our community.

#### Summer Highlight

CACH dedicated the summer months to launching our Rapid ReHousing program. We developed case manager training modules and established key partnerships to ensure the program's success.

#### Spring Highlight

During the spring, CACH focused on training coalition members and community stakeholders, providing in-depth sessions on Housing First, Coordinated Entry, and the Homeless Response System.

#### Fall Highlight

By fall, CACH's Rapid ReHousing program was fully operational, transitioning 14 households into permanent housing within its first two months, showcasing its potential for lasting community impact.

This year, CACH remained steadfast in our efforts to quickly transition individuals and families from homelessness to housing, using a comprehensive and strategic approach to drive meaningful change. Our commitment to being data-driven allowed us to continuously evaluate and refine our services, ensuring resources were allocated efficiently and programs targeted the most urgent needs within our community. By implementing evidence-based practices such as the Housing First model, we prioritized stable housing as a critical first step in addressing the broader challenges faced by those experiencing homelessness.

Additionally, we strengthened our collaboration with community partners, expanding our network of support to include landlords, local service providers, healthcare organizations, and employment resources. These partnerships have been instrumental in addressing the multifaceted barriers our clients face, from securing safe and affordable housing to accessing essential services like mental health care, substance use treatment, and employment services. Together, these efforts have allowed us to enhance the reach and impact of our programs, helping individuals and families rebuild their lives and work toward long-term self-sufficiency.

Ensure a family or individual can keep the lights on and the heat running, preventing disconnection and the stress of living without basic utilities.




#### A Key to Stability - **\$500**
